Feast of Adisham

The Feast of our Holy Father St. Benedict which rightly falls on 11th July was celebrated on 14th July 2014 at the novitiate house at Adisham which is dedicated to his name. The celebration began with the solemn Vespers on the previous evening, presided over by Fr. Yovan Saverimuttu OSB, the Vice Prior. The festive Mass was presided over by Rt. Rev. Dr. Winston Fernando SSS, Bishop

of Badulla who, in his sermon, reiterated that the values entailed in the life of St. Benedict under difficult circumstances, still holds good to every Christian by the very virtue of baptism. If one aspires to achieve holiness of life, he needs exemplary lives of saints like St. Benedict. The feast was well attended by the monks, the diocesan priests and religious men and women in the vicinity.



A Seminar for our Scholastics

A seminar/workshop for our scholastics was conducted from 25th to 27th of August by Rev. Fr. Anthonypillai SJ, an eminent retreat preacher and professional counselor. The theme of the seminar was **"Discovery of Oneself and of Another"**. The target is not merely for information and knowledge, but rather to identify ones strengths and weaknesses and respond generously to ones monastic calling. During the program, the scholastics were introduced into the Non-Violent Communication theory of Marshall Rosenberg, an approach used widely in human resource training. The new formation document of the Congregation too envisages such recurrent programs to be integrated during the time of formation.
